Bullying and Harassment Prevention Information

The Governing Board recognizes the harmful effects of bullying on student well-being, student learning and school attendance. The following information and resources are provided in an effort to promote a safe school environment and support students who may have experienced bullying or harassment.

Sex discrimination and harassment include, but are not limited to: (EC 230)

- 1. Exclusion of a person or persons from participation in, denial of the benefits of, or subjection to harassment or other discrimination in, any academic, extracurricular, research, occupational training, or other program or activity on the basis of sex.
- 2. Provision of different amounts or types of student financial aid, limitation of eligibility for student financial aid, or the application of different criteria to applicants for student financial aid or for participation in the provision of student financial aid by others on the basis of sex.
- 3. Exclusion from participation in, or denial of equivalent opportunity in, athletic programs on the basis of sex. For purposes of this subdivision, "equivalent" means equal or equal in effect.

Your Rights under the provisions of Title IX (Education Code 221.6 and 221.8)

- 1. You have the right to fair and equitable treatment and you shall not be discriminated against based on your sex.
- 2. You have the right to be provided with an equitable opportunity to participate in all academic extracurricular activities, including athletics.
- 3. You have the right to inquire of the athletic director of your school as to the athletic opportunities offered by the school.
- 4. You have the right to apply for athletic scholarships.
- 5. You have the right to receive equitable treatment and benefits in the provision of the following:
 - a. Equipment and supplies.
 - b. Scheduling of games and practices.
 - c. Transportation and daily allowances.
 - d. Access to tutoring.
 - e. Coaching.

- f. Locker rooms.
- g. Practice and competitive facilities.
- h. Medical and training facilities and services.
- i. Publicity.
- 6. You have the right to have access to a gender equity coordinator to answer questions regarding gender equity laws.

- 8. Students/parents/guardians have the right to file a formal written complaint in accordance with AR 1312.3 Uniform Complaint Procedures.
 - a. Complaints alleging unlawful discrimination shall be initiated no later than six (6) months from the date that the alleged discrimination occurred, or six (6) months from the date when the complainant first obtained knowledge of the facts of the alleged unlawful discrimination.
 - b. In conducting the investigation, the compliance officer shall collect all available documents and review all available records, notes, or statements related to the complaint, including any additional evidence or information received from the parties during the course of the investigation. The compliance officer shall individually interview all available witnesses with information pertinent to the complaint, and may visit any reasonably accessible location where the relevant actions are alleged to have taken place. At appropriate intervals, the compliance officer shall inform both parties of the status of the investigation.
- 9. You have the right to file a confidential discrimination complaint with the United States Office of Civil Rights or the State Department of Education if you believe you have been discriminated against or if you believe you have received unequal treatment on the basis of your sex.

Cyberbullying/Social Media Bullying

Cyberbullying includes the creation or transmission of harassing communications, direct threats, or other harmful texts, sounds, or images as defined in Education Code 48900. Cyberbullying also includes breaking into another person's electronic account and assuming that person's identity in order to damage that person's reputation. Cell phones may be searched based on reasonable grounds for suspecting cyberbullying.

Bullying on Social Media may include the following possible internet forums: websites with free registration and ease of registration, peer-to-peer instant messaging, comment forums or sections, and/or image or video posting platforms.
